

Thornborough Village Pond Project



Don't worry we haven't waded in and started with any improvements!

Currently much research is being undertaken and advice is being sought from the experts as well as local folks who have experience of the history and biodiversity of our Village Pond. If you have any historical information, pictures or stories about the pond and its use, its flora and fauna, we would be interesting in hearing from you.

Funding opportunities are also being researched to assist in supporting surveys from Ecologists / Wildlife Biodiversity

Consultants to establish the pond's baseline condition, and to provide advice on options, as well as funding for rehabilitation work and ongoing maintenance.

Any funding application would be strengthened:

- where it can show support for the project from residents
- where it incorporates an educational element; engaging with and getting support from Thornborough Pre-School, Thornborough Infant School, Thornborough Church (for outdoor church) is important
- with a comprehensive survey of the pond's flora and fauna to establish a baseline condition of the pond
- with expert advice on improvement options and best practice for any work to be undertaken on the pond

We need you to have your say......**The Village Pond Project will be part of the discussions at the Annual Parish Assembly Meeting on 24Th May 2023**. In the meantime, any thoughts, idea, offers of help would be appreciated. We could even form a 'Thornborough Conservation Group'?

Reflection from the Rectory by Rev'd Jacqueline Dove

The daffodils are here! Which makes me think of Wordsworth and Wales. They are like trumpets heralding spring and with spring the idea of resurrection, because I would suggest that the concept of resurrection is a good metaphor for spring and its symphony of new life.

I received an email from my chiropractor this week asking what season I am in regarding my health and wellbeing. For example, when all our healthy eating and exercise habits are dead in the ground, we can say we are in the winter season. The email encouraged me to hold onto the hope that winter always comes to an end and the green shoots of spring will come again with renewed hope and rejuvenation.

I have found in my own walk with God that spring always follows winter, I simply wait and pray for the green shoots of faith and hope and love to come again, as I put my trust in God's providential grace.

Easter follows lent in the same way spring follows winter. Lent offers us the opportunity for some honest reflection on our spiritual health as we prepare our hearts to enter into the mystery of Easter. It's such a huge mystery it takes six weeks to get ready. As we walk through lent, we notice the inclination of despair, fear, cynicism and self-absorption to win the day. With Easter we celebrate the good news that Christ came to demonstrate that hope is stronger than despair, love is stronger than fear and faith is stronger than cynicism. It is relatively easy to embrace these concepts of figurative resurrection. We have hopefully all experienced resurrected hope in our lives after a time of despair and resurrected love in our close relationships after a period of 'winter' when love has felt fallow.

At Easter we also celebrate the literal resurrection of Jesus. The great, good news of the Gospel is that *Jesus actually conquered death* — all death, every death, Death itself. So, in response to the news of someone's death, a Christian declares 'may they rest in peace and rise in glory'. For me, the love and compassion of a just God requires the making right of every death humanity has endured, every death that has left us staggering in shock, rage, bewilderment, and grief. For something deep and instinctive within us understands that we were created for life, and we feel robbed when life is taken away.

Science has taught us that the very existence of life on this planet is a miracle in itself. The vastness of this universe which is still expanding, is personally as incomprehensible to me as the idea of life after death. So let us put our trust in the God who created the heavens and the earth, knowing that not even death can separate us from his love. Happy Easter.

To mark His Majesty The King's Coronation thousands of organisations across the country are getting together to give us all the chance to help out in our own local communities.


Thornborough Parish Council are taking part, we would like to hold a litter pick and village tidy to include cleaning the street signs and the children's playground.

Thornborough Village Hall update

The village hall had its last major facelift 20 + year ago and needs a new one! We are raising funds now to ensure the village hall is something we can all be proud of & that meets the needs of the village for the next 20 years!

We received a grant from the National Lottery of £9,846 which has allowed us to commission the damp works. These start on Saturday 1st April and the village hall will be back in use on Wednesday 12th April. Huge thanks to Lynn Morgan for leading the charge on this grant application.

Next stage is to put together a detailed spec and obtain quotes which we will use to apply for additional grants. These works will include toilets, kitchen, storage area, decoration, heating, artwork and much more...

We are viewing the **Village Hall Heating & Lighting** as a specific project *and hoping there is someone who would like to be involved in this?* With the rising energy costs & the desire to find a green and energy efficient heating & lighting solution it would be wonderful if someone could invest time in looking at our options and develop a business plan. We can then use the business plan to source grant funding. This could be solar panels, air source heat pumps or would a more traditional solution work best given the constraints of the Village Hall being within the village conservation area? Potholes and road repairs - an important message from our ward councillor

Buckinghamshire Council continues to prioritise roads and has approved the release of an extra £5million, in addition to an already approved £100million investment over the four years, to support the Highways teams intensify and extend road repairs and improvements. The council commits to carrying out emergency repairs classed as 'category 1' defects where the road is unsafe, within two hours of being reported. It is essential residents continue to **report any defects to FixMyStreet (buckscc.gov.uk)** to ensure alongside their regular inspection, officers are alerted of any issues as quickly as possible.
