

Reflections from the Rectory by Rev'd Jacqueline Dove

I returned from two weeks in South Africa, where we celebrated my mother's 80th birthday and my parents 60th Wedding Anniversary, to find our garden had gone wild in our absence. Well strictly speaking I should say wilder as our gardening style embraces going wild. However, it feels like a tipping point has been reached in our absence and we have now tipped over into a fraction too much foliage. I can sense myself getting stressed rather than soothed by our 'English Country Garden' despite the multitude of butterflies and bees.

I'm wondering if my desire to exert more control over our garden has something to do with my lack of control with regard to my parent's welfare back in South Africa, where both parents have heart conditions and varying degrees of dementia. They need me and I can't be there for them which is hard to accept. This feeling of powerlessness was not helped by the fact they had a 48hr power cut the day we left which meant that, with the removal of the internet, we were even more cut off from each other. In the first WhatsApp audio message I received from my mother once the power was restored, she said, "I have been totally cut off from the entire world. I have learned to just rest in God.... I have had a wonderful, amazing time opening my presents, I can't tell you what I've got......God gives a little substitute; you've gone and I've got lovely presents to comfort me."

My mother and I have not always had an easy relationship. As a child and teenager, I was scared of her erratic rage and I found her eccentric dress sense and unconventional social skills deeply embarrassing. There was definitely at times a 'fraction too much friction' between us. I could view our relationship as I can view our garden – a bit of a mess full of nettles and thistles. But that would be to miss out on noticing the multitude of 'butterflies and bees'. Each WhatsApp message feels like a precious gift, even when it's a rather rambling shopping list (thanks to technology I do her weekly shop on-line). In our last conversation over brunch, before we flew home, my mother talked about the gift of grace that keeps her afloat, how she has faith that God will help her through this next difficult stage as my father's dementia worsens. Thinking I might have some Vicar wisdom to impart, I commented on the need to know when to rely on true grit and when to rely on grace. She replied that it takes true grit to cling onto grace with all you have. So may the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all this summer.

Thornborough and Coombs Woodland - New Quarry Project

As many will know the woodland incorporates Coombs Quarry, a regionally important geological site where fossil bearing Jurassic limestone can be seen. Some time ago we installed a picnic table in the area to enable visitors the quarry to stop and rest or to have some lunch. We are




delighted to inform you that we have received funding from *The National Grid Electricity Distribution Community Matters Fund* to further improve the area by creating a hard pathway to the quarry. This will make a *big difference to those with mobility issues who want visit the quarry, either for educational purposes or pleasure.*

Work will begin the week beginning 28th August and will last up to 6-7 days. During this time, due to the heavy machinery involved, access to the quarry area will be closed. However, there will be access to those parts of the quarry/woodland area not affected that will be clearly signposted.

Thornborough Parish Council: 'NO MOW MAY' 2023 & beyond Tell us your thoughts

TPC is acutely aware of the controversy caused when the new contractors working for Buckinghamshire Council decided to cut areas of the village that many residents would prefer were left to grow for the wildlife during 'No Mow May' 2023. This was particularly commented on by the residents of Chapel Lane, but we are aware of other areas of the village too.

Just to clarify, the responsibility for cutting areas such as the village greens, the Sport field and area outside the village hall belong to the Parish Council who arrange our own contractor to look after these areas. **Other areas fall under Buckinghamshire Council**. We can try to influence Buckinghamshire Council contractors if sufficient notice is given for their schedule.

As a village we need your thoughts on this matter.

We also need to consider the protection of the orchids growing in the grass banks around the village. We would appreciate your thoughts on the best way to do this.

TPC is aware that the cutting of verges to allow good visibility at road junctions must be maintained regardless of the decision on whether we decide to follow the developing national trend for 'No Mow May'. Many towns and villages are arranging for verges to be left to fill with wildflowers and grasses for insect life during this time.

Please send your thoughts and ideas to me or discuss with any member of the Thornborough Parish Council. We need to prepare for 2024 in good time.

Meanwhile we continue with the works we can manage ourselves. Many thanks to everyone who helped stick the skirting boards on, unfortunately they sprung off over-night so we now have non warped skirting boards primed and ready and we'll be asking for volunteers in the very near future. We will then apply a quick coat of paint and we'll be set until next summer.

This initiative is to help low income households reduce their energy consumptions and costs. Households are eligible for a free consultation if their income is £30,000 or less, they receive mean-tested state benefits or a member of the household is disabled. The other qualifying criteria requires the domestic property to have an energy performance certificate (EPC) rating of D, E. F or G , or for the property to be legally exempt from an EPC. The Nash Investment Club is seeking new members. Are you interested?

The Club is a long-established Investment Club with a proper constitution and rules, currently holding a portfolio of cash and shares worth around £84,000.

The club meets on the second Thursday of each month (over a glass of wine, etc) to review its investments and to make purchases on a "round robin" basis. It also undertakes social activities including meals and trips out as appropriate.

The club has a good track record since its formation over 23 years ago. For example, newer members who joined just over two years ago have made around 33% profit over that time based on their initial investment.

NIC currently has eleven members (evenly spread between sexes) but now has room for more owing to various movements. Whilst Nash-based, members are spread between Buckingham and Milton Keynes.

New members make an initial contribution of £100 and set up a direct debit payment of £25 per month to fund club share purchases. Funds can be withdrawn at any time (after notice) equivalent to the value of the member's portfolio.
