### Reflection from the Rectory by Rev'd Jacqueline Dove

I was licensed as Rector in September 2020 when most social gatherings were on hold, so it has been wonderful in the past months to take part in a number of social and village events. There was a Wedding Blessing and a Wedding, both glorious occasions. The Queen's Platinum Jubilee provided a perfect opportunity to celebrate together. Though celebrating together beyond our immediate family always requires a lot of effort it is very important. Whenever I see people coming together and making the effort to connect, despite the inevitable differences which threaten to keep us apart, I get the feeling I'm getting a glimpse of 'the Kingdom of God'. You might think it's probably because I've had one too many Prosecco's, that I'm seeing through rose-tinted glasses, but I believe it's the Holy Spirit opening my eyes to see the hidden things of God.

One of my favourite things is doing collective worship with the Thornborough Infant School. This week I told a story about someone who lived in a beautiful place. One day everything changed and they needed to leave their country, and they couldn't take all their special things with them. We talked about the Nikolaienkos family from Ukraine who are staying in Thornborough. The children did a prayer activity for Ukraine which involved wrapping blue and yellow wool around a cardboard cut-out of a dove and we listened to the Kiev Chamber Choir sing 'In Thy Kingdom'. It felt like a 'Kingdom of God' moment.

I am very grateful to Miss Quirke and Mrs Willmot for supporting the visit of the Bishop of Oxford to Thornborough. Walking the prayer labyrinth with the children as they followed Bishop Steven with his 'shepherd's crook' also felt like a 'Kingdom of God' moment. The children's joy and delight were contagious. I always say to the children that their super power is being able to fill our hearts with joy. If you would like to experience some of this joy you can either attend or volunteer to help with Messy Church and Explore@4 which are run jointly by the church and chapel.

If attending church is not for you perhaps you could consider supporting the church in other ways such as attending the Music in Quiet Places concert on the 30<sup>th</sup> July, and the Porch Sales on the second Saturday of every month. The church also provides a cool refuge in this heat; drinking water is available as well as a table with activities for children. If you have any other ideas of how we can make use of our beautiful ancient village church please let me know.

### **Draft Section 19 Flood Enquiry Report**

The Section 19 Flood Enquiry was set up by Buckinghamshire Council in response to the flooding in December 2020. The monthly bonus ball draw continues to happen and since the last publication there have been 2 more winners out of the bag:


