

## Reflection from the Rectory by Rev'd Jacqueline Dove

It has been a week since the Queen died and I found myself hugging our two dogs and telling them, "The Queen is dead." I am surprised by my sadness a week on from the breaking news. I wonder if it is because she was an emblem of goodness in a world which feels rather bleak at the moment. I also wonder if her death gives me permission to acknowledge and grieve the 'shocks to the system' we have all experienced over the past two years. Death is always such a shock despite it being very much a part of life. The world feels sadder without her presence with us.

As part of my Ordination, I swore allegiance to the Queen and was anointed with Chrism oil, the same oil used to anoint the Queen during her Coronation. The Queen took her calling and vows very seriously and she sets me a good example to emulate as I follow my calling and obey the vows I made. Anointing Kings and Queens and Priests goes back thousands of years with the oil representing God's Holy Spirit. Every person baptised (christened) in the Church of England is also anointed with chrism oil with a prayer that the Holy Spirit will help them daily to fulfil their baptism vows.

Clearly, being anointed by chrism oil does not automatically turn us into people that live by the values the Queen is known for. Plenty of Kings, Queens and Priests have done great harm. Plenty of Christians anointed with chrism oil are more inclined to hate their neighbour despite promising to follow Christ who told us to love our neighbour as we love ourselves. The Queen in her 1981 Christmas Broadcast said, "As human beings we generally know what is right and how we should act and speak. But we are also very aware of how difficult it is to have the courage of our convictions."

We are told that the Queen prayed every day, kneeling by her bed when she still could. Her faith was something she nurtured so that it was able give her the courage of her convictions. The result is that the Queen is loved and admired all around the world because of the values she represents. I will let the Queen have the last word:

"I know just how much I rely on my own faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. Each day is a new beginning .... I draw strength from the message of hope in the Christian gospel." *Christmas Broadcast 2002* 

## **Thornborough Methodist Chapel**



Did you know: Methodism

The Methodist Church is a Protestant Christian denomination which began primarily through the work of John Wesley (1703–1791), an Anglican priest who led a revival in Britain. They became known as 'Methodists' because of the methodical way in which they carried out their Christian faith. It was called a Nonconformist church because it did not conform to the rules of the established Church of England. Methodist services can be structured with liturgy taken from a service book but commonly include free forms of worship. It is the fourth-largest Christian group in Britain. Around 202,000 people attend a Methodist church service each week, while about 500,000 take part in some other form of Methodist activity, such as youth work and community events organised by local churches. See below some of these events which we in Thornborough organise.


