- d) AVDC Changes In Planning Communication The Clerk has now received an answer from Cllr Mrs S Polhill to the letter sent to her by Thornborough Parish Council with the points TPC considers were not covered in her original reply sent to all parishes. The response was not felt to be helpful and there was concern about the time frame needed to print plans that would need to be taken to specialist printers.
- e) Response re Neighbourhood Development Plan Programme from Great Horwood PC The Clerk has contacted Great Horwood Parish Council but as they meet on the same night as TPC, the Chairman was unable to attend the TPC meeting although he has offered to respond if we would like to send him a list of questions. Taking the information from both 'The 18 Week Neighbourhood Development Plan Programme' seminar and the NBPPC meeting brought to this and to the last meeting by the Clerk, Councillors felt that a Neighbourhood Plan for Thornborough would be too costly and probably not much protection from development. Agreed not to take this issue forward at present.

b) TPC Budget and Precept request

The Clerk presented a document showing Thornborough Budget - Year 2013-2014, Estimate and Current Position (October 2014) 2014-15. Councillors were given copies. The Clerk has received the annual request for the amount TPC wish to raise as the Precept for 2015-16. The Thornborough parish Tax-base figure for 2015/16 is 291.31, The Clerk explained that houses below and above Band D are assessed as a percentage of Band D and then all added up resulting in a figure which decides the number of Band D equivalent tax amounts that will be gathered. Councillors will look at the Budget document to inform a decision on how much Precept TPC needs to raise in total to be taken at the next meeting.

c) Requests for Funding from Dial-A-Ride, Citizens' Advice Bureau
The Clerk has checked and no-one in the parish uses the Dial-A-Ride service.
TPC therefore agreed not to donate. TPC felt that Citizen's Advice Bureau was an important service. Proposed that TPC send a donation of £150, proposed by Cllr CM, seconded by Cllr MS, agreed unanimously.

Appendix 1

North Bucks Parishes Planning Consortium meetings, 23th October 2014

AV Local Plan Meeting

- Several people had attended this meeting on 16th October in the evening. There were three
 documents sent out to all who attended (but NOT to parishes who sent no representative. However I
 have received the three documents from NBPPC). Peter Williams, team leader for Forward Planning,
 (new to AVDC, probably hired specifically to sort this out), gave presentation and was very good.
- There will have to be a huge amount of development, 1500 new houses a year over 5 years across Aylesbury Vale.
- A development at Aston Clinton was refused but won on appeal proving that Aylesbury Vale has no effective 5 year plan in place. This cost AVDC and as a result they have adopted the default position of agreeing to almost every development plan. An 85 house development was accepted on the edge of Tingewick immediately. This could easily happen to Thornborough as any of the surrounding field (e.g., between the village and the A421) could possibly be developed.
- Every settlement must expect a 15% increase in housing over the next 5 years, for Thornborough this would be between 36 and 40 houses.
- There are currently 7 applications for developments at Haddenham alone.
- The National Planning Policy Framework is in favour of all sustainable development, so unless there is a really good planning reason all development will be accepted.

- Large planning developments are of less interest to AVDC as they take years to plan and complete and therefore can't so easily be put against the yearly target of 1500 houses completed, but small developments are of great interest as they will complete faster.
- The 5 year housing supply is calculated on what is deliverable within the 5 years.
- Secretary of State can over-rule the Inspector even if you have a NP
- Appeals to be heard in January: Fleet Marston, Watermead, Bierton and other Aylesbury planned developments
- Winslow recently had a development which was refused on an appeal made by a member of the public on procedural grounds. However, when it was reported in the Buckingham Advertiser it was stated by Aylesbury Vale Development Control that they would allow the development once an application was made again correctly, which then happened despite the fact that it wasn't in the Winslow NP. Winslow is now considering appealing on the grounds that it isn't in their NP.
- Submissions on the VALP need to be back to AVDC by 16th November.
- Two areas that need to be addressed are the issues of settlement boundaries (currently these don't exist) and community coalescence (settlements expanding till they join up). Agreed that NBPPC will raise these issues with AVDC.

Planning Application Process

- There was a long discussion on this issue. There have been many complaints. Jeff Membery who is the main contact for this issue and is sending out all the information was previously in the Benefits Manager when that team was reviewed and is seen as AVDC's enforcer'. (He was the person who put through the closure of the two Council Offices in Buckingham and Winslow).
- Various ideas were put forward such as offering to pay for the printing,, asking the applicant to pay more to cover printing for parishes, asking the applicant to provide plans for the parish etc etc.
- The new planning we pages for each parish should be coming very soon.

Neighbourhood Plans

- Everywhere is vulnerable to housing development as developers will look at any and every field with a view to development on the edge of any settlement.
- Currently AVDC are agreeing to almost all development applications.
- The Secretary of State has made it clear that Neighbourhood Plans provide protection even where there is no up to date Local District Plan.
- Buckingham NP has had to be started again as AVDC got the map wrong.
- Peter Williams has said that Aylesbury Vale District Council's main efforts will be on getting the VALP done BUT they have a duty to support the writing of NPs and get £30,000 for each NP accepted by the Secretary of State.
